OUR INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Our eight-week Summer Internship Program allows intellectually curious undergraduate students to participate in a range of didactic seminars, network with professionals working in health fields, assist Columbia staff and faculty with innovative research projects, and build meaningful relationships with other students



Learning Opportunities

Learn from clinicians, researchers, and other professionals about ethical and creative mental health interventions focused on the needs of various global communities



Skills Development

Expand your research skillset with various qualitative and quantitative skills (e.g. literature reviews, manuscript preparation, content and data analysis). There will also be opportunities to refine public speaking and presenting skills



Career Support

Receive experienced guidance on global mental health careers and applications, and other practical advice for success (e.g. resumés, grad school (Master's vs. PhD), goal setting)



ELIGIBILITY

Internship positions are selected on a competitive basis and open to rising senior undergraduate students interested in global mental health.

In the past, the Undergraduate Summer Internship Program has attracted applicants with a wide range of academic interests (e.g. policy, gender studies, medicine).

We are open to any and all majors.

VIRTUAL FORMAT

The 2025 program is planned to be completely virtual with no requirement to travel to Columbia University.

If funding is not available through their university, students may apply for a stipend from the CCGMH Summer Scholars Fund for up to \$2,000.
